Pursuant to Rule 26(1), Mr. SCHELLENBERG, Mrs. DRIEDGER, Ms. OSWALD, Messrs. LOEWEN and ALTEMEYER made Members' Statements.

The House resumed the Adjourned Debate on the Proposed Motion of Hon. Mr. MACKINTOSH:

THAT Bill (No. 6) – The Cross-Border Policing Act/Loi sur les services de police interterritoriaux, be now read a Second Time and be referred to a Committee of this House.

And the debate continuing,

And Messrs. HAWRANIK, SCHULER and LAMOUREUX, Mrs. TAILLIEU and Hon. Mr. MACKINTOSH having spoken,

And the Question being put. It was agreed to.

The Bill was accordingly read a Second Time and referred to a Committee of this House.

The House resumed the Interrupted Debate on the Proposed Motion of Hon. Mr. MACKINTOSH:

THAT Bill (No. 17) – The Domestic Violence and Stalking Prevention, Protection and Compensation Amendment Act/Loi modifiant la Loi sur la violence familiale et la protection, la prévention et l'indemnisation en matière de harcèlement criminel, be now read a Second Time and be referred to a Committee of this House.

And the debate continuing,

And Mrs. DRIEDGER, Messrs. SCHULER, MAGUIRE and LAMOUREUX and Hon. Mr. MACKINTOSH having spoken,

And the Question being put. It was agreed to.

The Bill was accordingly read a Second Time and referred to a Committee of this House.

The House resumed the Adjourned Debate on the Proposed Motion of Hon. Mr. MACKINTOSH:

THAT Bill (No. 18) – The Improved Enforcement of Support Payments (Various Acts Amended) Act/Loi visant à faciliter la perception des paiements alimentaires (modification de diverses dispositions législatives), be now read a Second Time and be referred to a Committee of this House.

And the debate continuing,

And leave having been denied to have the matter remain in the name of Mr. DERKACH,

And Messrs. HAWRANIK and LAMOUREUX, Hon. Messrs. GERRARD and MACKINTOSH having spoken,

And the Question being put. It was agreed to.

The Bill was accordingly read a Second Time and referred to a Committee of this House.

By leave, the Order of the Day being read for consideration of Report Stage Amendment of Bill (No. 7) – The Criminal Property Forfeiture Act/Loi sur la confiscation pénale de biens, as amended and reported from the Standing Committee on Legislative Affairs:

Mr. HAWRANIK moved:

THAT Bill 7 be amended by replacing subsection 16(1) with the following:

Protected holders of prior interests

16(1) The following are entitled to a protection order in respect of property that is found to be proceeds of unlawful activity or an instrument of unlawful activity:

(a) any of the following holders of a prior registered interest in the property:

(i) a bank, a credit union, or a trust or loan corporation with a business authorization under Part XXIV of The Corporations Act,

(ii) an insurance company licensed under The Insurance Act,

(iii) the government, a municipality or a local government district,

(iv) a member of a class of holders, prescribed by regulation, who are similar to the holders set out in subclause (i) or (ii);

(b) the holder of an interest in the property that is

(i) a prior registered interest that is referred to in section 141 of The Real Property Act,

(ii) not registered, but if it were registered, would be an interest referred to in section 141 of The Real Property Act, or

(iii) a prior registered interest that is prescribed by regulation.

And a debate arising,

And Messrs. HAWRANIK, SCHULER and LAMOUREUX having spoken,

And the Question being put on the amendment. It was agreed to.

By leave, the House resumed the Adjourned Debate on the Proposed Motion of Hon. Mr. MACKINTOSH:

THAT Bill (No. 7) – The Criminal Property Forfeiture Act/Loi sur la confiscation pénale de biens, as amended and reported from the Standing Committee on Legislative Affairs, and subsequently amended, be concurred in and be now read for a Third Time and passed.

And the debate continuing,

And Hon. Mr. MACKINTOSH having spoken.

And the Question being put. It was agreed to.

The Bill was accordingly concurred in, read a Third Time and passed.

The House resumed the Adjourned Debate on the Proposed Motion of Hon. Ms. MELNICK:

THAT Bill (No. 8) – The Employment and Income Assistance Amendment Act (One-Tier Assistance for Rural and Northern Manitoba)/Loi modifiant la Loi sur l'aide à l'emploi et au revenu (prestateur unique d'aide pour les régions rurales et du nord du Manitoba), reported from the Standing Committee on Legislative Affairs, be concurred in and be now read for a Third Time and passed.

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And the debate continuing,

And leave having been denied to have the matter remain in the name of Mrs. ROWAT,

And Mrs. DRIEDGER, by leave Mrs. ROWAT, Mr. LAMOUREUX and Hon. Ms. MELNICK having spoken.

And the Question being put. It was agreed to.

The Bill was accordingly concurred in, read a Third Time and passed.
