Hon. Mr. GOERTZEN, the Minister of Health, Seniors and Active Living, made a statement regarding this week being Emergency Medical Services week.

Pursuant to Rule 27(1), Messrs. MARTIN, ALTEMEYER, EWASKO and WHARTON and Ms. LAMOUREUX made Members' Statements.

Pursuant to Rule 47(2), the debate on the Address in Reply to the Speech from the Throne was interrupted by the Government House Leader in order to call the Government Resolution titled Trans-Pacific Partnership.

Hon. Mr. CULLEN moved:

WHEREAS Manitoba's exports to Trans-Pacific Partnership countries averaged more than \$9 billion annually from 2012 to 2014; and

WHEREAS the Trans-Pacific Partnership will support economic growth and job creation by eliminating tariffs on almost all of Manitoba's key exports while providing access to new opportunities in the Asia-Pacific region; and

WHEREAS exclusion from the Trans-Pacific Partnership would close access to critical trade markets and put Manitoba jobs at risk.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislative Assembly of Manitoba confirm its support for the Trans-Pacific Partnership and call on the Federal Government to take the necessary actions to ratify the agreement.
