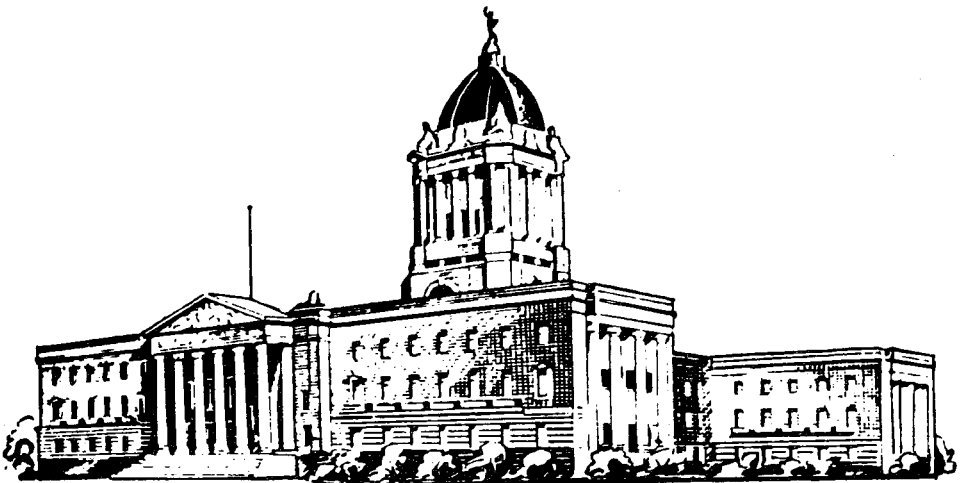

CHAIRMAN: Mr. J. Wally McKenzie.

MR. CHAIRMAN: The committee will come to order. We, the Standing Committee on Law Amendments, are dealing tonight with:

Bill No. 30 — An Act to amend The Civil Service Superannuation Act

Bill No. 31 — An Act to amend The Personal Property Security Act

Bill No. 44 — An Act to amend The Corporations Act

Bill No. 58 — An Act to amend The Education Department Act

Are there any people or citizens in the room that would like to speak on any of these bills?

BILL NO. 30, An Act to amend The Civil Service Superannuation Act, was read and passed.

MR. CHAIRMAN: Bill No. 31, An Act to amend The Personal Property Security Act, Clause 47(2)(d), 1—pass; Subsection 49(4), 2—pass — the Honourable Member for Rhineland.

MR. ARNOLD BROWN: Mr. Chairman, I move that proposed clause 47(2)(d) of The Personal Property Security Act as set up in Section 1, of Bill 31, be amended by striking out the word “declaration” in the first line thereof and substituting therefor the word “statement”.

MR. CHAIRMAN: Legal Counsel.

MR. TALLIN: There was some concern among some of the credit grantors that declaration might be interpreted as being a statutory declaration, which means that it would have to be taken before a Commissioner for Oaths or Notary Public. The intention was that the financial statement would just include a statement to this effect, not that it would have to be a sworn statement. (

The remainder of Bill 31 was read and passed.)

MR. CHAIRMAN: Bill No. 44, An Act to amend The Corporations Act.
(Pages 1 - 18 were each read and passed.)

MR. CHAIRMAN: Legal Counsel.

MR. TALLIN: Would the committee permit me to change Section 76 on Page 19 so that it would read, “this Act comes into force on the day it receives the Royal Assent,” to remove all this question of whether or not June 15th had passed or not?

MR. CHAIRMAN: Agreed? (Agreed)

(The remainder of Bill 44 was read and passed.)

BILL NO. 58, an Act to amend The Education Department Act, was read and passed.

MR. CHAIRMAN: That concludes the matter that is referred to the committee tonight. Committee rise.
