

RE - Proposed New Hazardous Waste Facility on Sabrina in Headingley



This proposal is completely out of character and in too close proximity to our upscale single family residential community.



I believe that this location is so low and wet that it could reasonably be expected to create high flood risk and a very difficult clean up problem.



A key element of stewardship is the concept that the producer should look after his own waste, I believe that Headingley should not take responsibility for wastes from other jurisdictions.



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The applicant appears to want to undertake a significant amount of unprocessed waste transfer and is seeking approval for unlimited commodities which could include PCBs



A propane storage facility and a flammable hazardous waste facility in close proximity do not make sense. As well an unprotected rail crossing leading to both seems very risky.



There is a risk of contaminating the aquifer because of wells and septic fields in the community and this could put community water at risk.



Headingley firefighters are not trained or equipped to fight a fire or spill at such a facility. Eg Speedway fire in 2013 in Winnipeg.



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No public access to independent material to understand and evaluate the risks and there does not appear to be 24 hour supervision.

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
