



Get out there and experience fresh from the farm

Whether you shop, pick or have your produce grown, this guide will help you access fresh local produce in the way that best suits you. There are several ways to access local produce this season in Manitoba:

- Farmers' markets • Pre-picked market stands • U-Pick vegetable gardens • Invest in and share the harvest of local producers



Farmers' Markets

You can stock up on fresh food and local goods at any of the many farmers' markets around the province. Producers grow, pick, make and sell a variety of quality local fruit, vegetables, fresh baked goods, home preserves and unique crafts. Farmers' markets bring several producers together in one location to sell their goods directly to consumers. Each producer has a separate stall or stand at the market. Members of the Farmers Markets Association of Manitoba Co-op Inc. are identified in this guide and online at www.fmam.ca.



Pre-Picked Market Stands

These are usually roadside stands on or near the property of the farmers. The farmers pick the produce for you and replenish the supplies with fresh produce daily. The advantage of going to roadside stands is that you can talk to the growers one-on-one about the way they farm and how to get the most out of their produce. Some stands specialize in a few particular varieties of produce, while others have a broader range, depending on the growing conditions of each farm or market garden.



U-Pick Vegetable Gardens


You can harvest your vegetables yourself and get the pick of the crop at U-Pick vegetable gardens. Enjoy fresh air and exercise while you shop. You also have the opportunity to talk to growers one-on-one. Bring along the family, friends and neighbours, add a picnic lunch and make a day of it. You'll have fun and take home tasty, hand-picked produce.



Community Supported Agriculture (CSA) Farms

This is a unique way to form partnerships between farmers and their customers. As a customer, you become a member by investing a fee in the farmers' crops in the spring. When the crops are harvested, you receive a share of the vegetables the farmer grows. Every CSA is unique. Contact these farms directly to find out more information and how they operate. The night Canada stood still : how the 1995 Quebec referendum nearly cost us our country / Robert Wright. Toronto : HarperCollins Canada, 2014. xiv 351 pages. FC 2926.9 R4 Wri

From **The Toronto Star**:

In *The Night Canada Stood Still*, [...]Wright describes the players on both sides of the vote, including Chrétien and Parizeau and their top advisers. With the exception of Bouchard, the No forces are examined more extensively. Rightly, Bouchard is this book's central character. No script writer could dream up a better protagonist than a man who energized the Yes campaign when he returned in February 1995, already an icon with his prosthetic leg and crutches. Later, his symbol became his cane. [...] On Oct. 30, 1995, Quebecers came within a razor's edge of

voting to become a sovereign country. [...]

Separatism appears out of fashion. Young Quebecers don't seem to share the dream of their aging parents for an independent country. Perhaps it's an idea that's gone for good — but that would be too risky a bet to make.

Wright certainly makes it clear that, while Bouchard is “not quite so bullish,” Parizeau's dream remains alive. He quotes a bold Parizeau prophesy from 2010: “Quebec will make a third bid for independence. The strategy and tactics remain to be defined.”





A strike gripped Winnipeg from May 15 to June 26, 1919. Some twenty-five thousand workers walked out, demanding better wages and union recognition. Red-fearing opponents insisted labour radicals were attempting to usurp constitutional authority and replace it with Bolshevism. Newspapers like the Manitoba Free Press claimed themselves political victims and warned of Soviet infiltration. Supporters of the general sympathetic strike like the Toronto Daily Star maintained that strikers were not Reds; they were workers fighting for their fair rights. What was really happening in




From **McNally Robinson**:

For more than a century academics have had unique rights -- to speak, teach, and write freely. Central to the case for academic freedom is that scholars must be able to voice their views free of fear in order for society to gain a better understanding of ourselves and our world and to be effective teachers.

Academic freedom has always faced challenges. Professors have been pressed to alter their work because it offends powerful interests -- both inside and outside the university. Some have been fired or denied jobs for their political views, their criticisms of colleagues and administrators, and their refusal to buckle under corporate pressures to hush up research findings. The sixteen contributors to this volume cite many such instances in Canada and the U.S. More significantly, they point out how governments, corporations, and university administrators today are seeking to narrow academic freedom. [...]

From **Book News**:

When a new politician runs for office, one expects a certain amount and type of news coverage: views, family, education, events attended, and so forth. However, Goodyear-Grant has found a surprising amount of bias in reporting. Women are more likely to be judged on their looks than on their views, and even the most careful and circumspect woman is more likely to have her personal life examined than is any man. That is not surprising, but it is how the media goes about it that is interesting. [...]

Goodyear-Grant explains the subtle and not subtle ways the news is gender-biased, then concentrates on the effects of outright attack-style news, and closes with the media effects on politicians' experience of their political careers. Women may have come into politics in increasing numbers, but they are still prevented from succeeding by gender bias in the media.
