The Legislative Library's Inter-Library Loan service

SNT

Interlibrary loans allow clients to borrow items owned by other libraries. They increase the scope of the library's collection to allow access to items that might not otherwise be available to library users.

The Legislative Library can initiate a loan from many libraries throughout Canada and around the world for our registered borrowers. We also lend circulating materials to other libraries




and institutions for their library patrons. The interlibrary loan service for employees of the Manitoba government is offered for work-related items required to fill their information needs. Requests for leisure reading, course materials, genealogy, etc. should be directed to a public library or academic library.

Members of the public can contact their local public library with any requests for materials held by the Legislative Library.

There are no charges to libraries for borrowing materials on interlibrary loan from the Legislative Library. However, some libraries do charge for the lending service.

Valley of the Birdtail: an Indian reserve, a white town, and the road to reconciliation /


From the publisher:

Divided by a beautiful valley and 150 years of racism, the town of Rossburn and the Waywayseecappo Indian reserve have been neighbours nearly as long as Canada has been a country. Their story reflects much of what has gone wrong in relations between Indigenous Peoples and non-Indigenous Canadians. It also offers, in

the end, an uncommon measure of hope.

Valley of the Birdtail is about how two communities became separate and unequal—and what it means for the rest of us. In Rossburn, once settled by Ukrainian immigrants who fled poverty and persecution, family income is near the national average and more than a third of adults have graduated from university. In Waywayseecappo, the average family lives below the national poverty line and less than a third of adults have graduated from high school, with many haunted by their time in residential schools.

This book follows multiple generations of two families, one white and one Indigenous, and weaves their lives into the larger story of Canada. It is a story of villains and heroes, irony and idealism, racism and reconciliation. Valley of the Birdtail has the ambition to change the way we think about our past and show a path to a better future.




